Illinois Governor JB Pritzker's new executive order, modifying and extending the state's Stay-at-Home order through May, takes effect today.

Enforcing the Face Covering Requirement - Serving our Customers, Together

Anyone over age two, medically able to tolerate a face covering, is now required to do so in public places where they are not able to maintain a six-foot distance from others, notably including indoor spaces such as stores.

The best thing we can do for our customers and visitors is to provide a safe place to shop, dine, and recreate in Gurnee! Signage at businesses' front entrance will serve as a helpful reminder of the face covering requirement; if a patron refuses to comply and is *asked to leave* the premises, it then becomes a trespassing charge which is enforceable by the Gurnee Police Department. It's important that patrons not be allowed to enter the store without a face covering. Use 9-1-1 for immediate Police response. For advance (non-emergency) guidance, feel free to contact the Department at 847-599-7000 and request to speak with a supervisor. These are challenging times, and we are here to help our businesses navigate them.

Other modifications in the new extended order will allow:

- retail stores not considered essential to provide curbside pickup or delivery of orders
 - We've Got It TO GO! Please support Gurnee businesses offering TO GO services
 - many Gurnee Mills retailers will be offering curbside pickup at entrances B and E (or anchor stores' own lots), Monday— Saturday, 11am-6pm, Sunday 12pm-5pm
- greenhouses/nurseries/garden centers and pet grooming services to reopen
- some state parks to be reopened
- fishing and boating with no more than two people
- golf courses to reopen under strict guidelines. <u>Bittersweet Golf Club</u> is open and accepting tee time reservations at 847.855.9031
- schools to establish procedures and allow pick-up of necessary supplies and student belongings
- hospitals and surgi-centers to resume certain elective procedures

Readiness for Reopening

This <u>Business Supply/Resource Guide</u> assists with sourcing of masks, gloves, cleaning and sanitizing supplies/services, shields, and other critical supplies needed to reopen.

Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) Mandatory Posting

This notification is now required by IDPH to be posted where employees are physically reporting to a worksite.

Lake County Health Department (LCHD) Business Briefings

A weekly Covid-19 briefing is offered on Thursdays at 11:00AM, specifically tailored to the business community. Sign up for conference calls, listen to past recordings, and submit your questions.

Financial Assistance

Rapid Response funds have been made available via local workforce development agencies to assist small businesses in mitigating layoffs and adhering to social distancing provisions.
