#### Jerry Kolar 3641 Highland Gurnee, IL

Mr. Kolar read a passage from an email he received from Mayor Kovarik regarding the North Shore Water Reclamation District.

He said before a tax can be charged an ordinance must be passed first before annexation can take place and no such ordinance exists according to a FOIA he filed.

Mr. Kolar said he has been taxed \$1384 so far and he has a list of over 300 others that are being taxed and are not receiving the services.

He said he met with the Assistant to the Village Administrator about this matter.

Attorney Winter said he hasn't worked with Jack regarding this request but he will take a look into it.

Mr. Kolar said the previous Mayor admitted it was an error. He said he is getting no service out of sanitary district and still being taxed. He said something has got to be done.

Mayor Kovarik said she will look into the legalities of the issue by having the Village Attorney look into it.
