Treasurer's Report

Period Ending October 31, 2019

Gosnell highlighted balance and revenues. A beginning balance of \$1,153,477.54, expenditures of \$456,695.04 and surcharges and interest where they should be. The ending balance is at \$1,546,512.33 which matches the bank statement. After the 2 pending expenditure requests the balance will be \$1,169,178.05.

9-1-1 Answering Equipment / Trunks / MSAG

9-1-1 Network Costs – AT&T / Illinois State Police

The bills continue to be reviewed and there are no changes.

Illinois NG9-1-1 Implementation

The State has done an RFP for the backend of Next Generation 9-1-1. It is Chairman Velkover's understanding that the State has not made an award, are considering rejecting the bids and going back out to RFP.

Chairman Velkover advised that there is measurable progress on the County work on Next Generation 9-1-1 GIS information/coordination and submittal of information to the State.

Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD)

Priority Dispatch Pro QA Medical Software Project

The software application was installed and training has begun.

CAD System

Tritech ProQA Paramount Interface EMD

A ProQA Interface setup has been completed on training CAD with CAD-Live to follow at a later date. There is a tentative go-live date in January 2020

RFP MDC Award

Mann updated the Board that the RFP was awarded to CDW and the order was placed. The last parts were delivered this past week and the first 4 vehicles for change over will be going to the upfitter next week. The first 4 vehicles will be done prior to December 23rd. The remaining vehicles will then be worked on beginning January 6th. The entire project should be done by the first or second week of February.

Radio Systems

Quad 1 & Gurnee Fire Radio System Implementation

A successful JPS voter test was completed last week. Testing and cutover of the voter was scheduled for yesterday but the vendor expressed some concern over the weather. It has been rescheduled.

Chief Smith inquired about North Chicago Fire and the use of Quad 1. Chairman Velkover stated a conversation was had with Don Hansen from Mundelein in reference to North Chicago moving to Quad 4, however, Quad 4 did not have the transmit power to reach all the way to Lake Michigan. An option of multicasting was brought up and that proposal was rejected by various entities due to the amount of additional call volume that would be placed on Quad 1.

Zion Police UHF System Operation / Starcom 21 Field Testing

Work has begun with Phil Brunell but testing has not been put into place. Some pricing has been obtained for Motorola radios as well. Discussion was made about some possible grant funds being available and will be explored by Henderson. Troy brought up that they have police radios in some of their rigs now and got information that there is a Starcom \$100.00 a year listen only interoperability option that can be explored.

PSAP Metropolitan Area Network

Point to Point Microwave Network

This has been operational since late August. There has been no downtime since put in service and it is being monitored in the overall Network Monitoring System.

Facilities

Communications Center - Liebert Condenser Replacement

The condensers are original to the building. A smaller unit was replaced several months ago. This is one of the larger units and will be a 50/50 split for the cost and is up later in the agenda for purchase consideration. Chairman Velkover thanked Director of Support Services John Petersen for his work on this project.

Preventative Maintenance Report – APC Symmetra UPS – 09/05/2019

Tests were completed and no issues were reported.

Lake County Regional Consolidation Committee

DRAFT Regional 9-1-1 Consortium Concept of Operations and Implementation Plan Lake County CAD/RMS/JMS Consultant RFP

The group has an approved plan that has gone through both the Operations and Policy committees. They are looking for everyone in the county to review that and gauge the level of participation. Kavanagh highlighted this evolved into a 3 prong plan. The first being spending your own money to invest in technology as everyone else. The second is a joint group to get together to establish SOP's and purchase all the same equipment/software to ensure interoperability. The third option is a full consolidation of partners. At this time "what is the cost" is biggest question being raised. One proposal was to join all ETSB's together with the Lake County ETSB. There was not much traction on this. There has been good information that has come out of this process and good partnerships created.
