	Gosnell said it was up 7.8% from the previous year.
	Mayor Kovarik asked if there was any further information on the municipal distributions from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).
	Gosnell noted the Treasury is still working on guidance and the number of units of government in Illinois is being reviewed to make sure the distributions are following the intent of ARPA.
	Trustee Thorstenson motioned, seconded by Trustee Garner, to recommend approval of Fiscal Year 2021/2022 Proposed Budget.
