

Catalytic Converter Theft


2,969 Claims in 2019 52,206 Claims in 2021

1,215% Increase in claims nation-wide

Serial numbers are not traditionally used

Difficult to track

New laws would require record keeping & limits value of recycled parts

Platinum = \$1,046 per ounce




Palladuim = \$2,053 per ounce

Prevention Efforts



Catalytic converters can be removed in less than a minute. Make it harder for thieves to access your vehicle to prevent this costly theft

Motor Vehicle Burglary


Valuable items:

- Electronics
- Credit cards / cash
- Keys

Most common ways vehicles are broken into:

- Unlocked
- Window smashed

Thefts occur all hours of the day or night






Motor Vehicle Theft

Auto thefts are up 16.5% nation-wide from 2019 Most common ways vehicles are stolen:

- Unlocked/Keys Inside
- Vehicles Running

Motor Vehicle Theft


Any vehicle parked outside is a target

86% of motor vehicle thefts were reported to police in 2020.

Total motor vehicle thefts









Element 1


Gain a basic understanding of the situation

Element 2

Become attuned to your environments

Element 3

A predetermined mindset will help you take rapid and effective actions

Preparation:

Element 1

Look at your environment through the lens of survival

Element 2

"What If" questions are critical in developing effective response strategies

Element 3

Survivors prepare themselves physically, mentally, and emotionally to do whatever it takes to survive
