Suspect Arrested for Armed Robbery

Gurnee – On August 5, 2021, at approximately 12:45 PM, Gurnee Police responded to Tri-State Parkway and Lakeside Drive after receiving reports of a man with a gun. Upon arrival, officers located the victim, a 46-year-old male from Kenosha, WI, who was uninjured from the incident.

The preliminary investigation revealed Tyler D Jackson, 18, of Waukegan, IL, contacted the victim to sell him merchandise. The victim arrived at the agreed-upon location, Tri-State Parkway and Lakeside Drive, and allowed Jackson and a second unknown individual into his vehicle. As the transaction was occurring, a weapon was brandished at the victim in an attempt to rob him. During the commission of the robbery, the victim attempted to grab the handgun and fight off the subjects. A round was discharged, and no one was injured. Jackson and the unknown individual ran from the scene before police arrived.

Gurnee Officers, with the assistance of Gurnee Police K9 Hunter, searched the area for the subjects. Jackson was located a short distance away and was taken into custody without incident. The other subject remains at large. He was described as a thin, African American male in his late teens, with short twist braids.

Tyler D Jackson was charged with Aggravated Robbery and Battery.
